We are writing to you to ask for a letter of support for our application to Gwall Trust for funding to purchase new golf course equipment.

We are applying for \$59,696.00 to purchase a brand-new Jacobsen LF570 Their half fairway mower, ride-on, 8'4" cut width, from Rollins Machinery. This is the total price, including freight & all taxes.

Our current fairway mowing is done with a 1980 Ford tractor pulling an even older Brouwer reel mower. It is extremely difficult to get parts for them; they are over 40 years old. Breakdowns are more and more frequent and we have no 'backup' fairway mower.

Golfing is an exceptional sport in many ways - healthy exercise combined with pleasant companionship, good fun, and competition with others and oneself. It teaches patience, physical co-ordination, and good sportsmanship to golfers of all ages - well worth supporting!

Details about us: We are a non-profit society. We run the golf course in Masset completely with volunteers. Both our member and non-member rates are affordable. At a time when many golf courses across North America are closing due to financial difficulties, we are proud to still be able to offer such a great sport to a very wide range of people: seniors, adults, teens, children, beginners and experienced golfers, tourists and all-island residents. We rent the property from the military. The course runs on the honour payment system from April 1 to Oct. 15, and is free for the winter (Oct.16 to March 31). We hope to continue to operate for many years to come.

#### **RE: Update on the BC Hydro Smart Metering Program**

Since July 2011, when we began installing new meters, we have been working with customers to answer questions about the new system. Over 1.7 million new meters have now been installed across B.C. and the meter exchange phase of the BC Hydro Smart Metering Program is nearing completion. However, this important grid upgrade cannot be completed until all customers have new meters.

We will be providing a notification letter to these customers who do not have a new modern meter to let them know that an installer will be revisiting their premises to exchange the meter in the coming weeks and to offer another opportunity to have their questions answered.

#### Why is BC Hydro replacing the old meter?

BC Hydro has a responsibility to ensure safe, cost effective electricity delivery to homes and businesses all around the province. The old meters are becoming obsolete and require BC Hydro to manually perform services that have now been automated. In order to continue to serve customers without a new meter, we would have to set-up up a costly and separate customized system - and the cost of this would have to be subsidized by other BC Hydro customers who have a new meter.

#### **Working with Customers**

BC Hydro has responded to dozens of questions from customers about the new meters and the answers are available at <a href="https://www.bchydro.com/smartmeters">www.bchydro.com/smartmeters</a>. For example, we have:

- confirmed through testing by a federal consumer protection agency that the new meters are accurate;
- confirmed through testing, certified by professional engineers, that the meters use technology that has been confirmed to be safe and has been used safely for decades by households and communities around the world; and
- worked with the privacy commissioner's office to meet all standards and guidelines.

As always, customers can choose to relocate the meter base to a different location on their property, in accordance with local electrical guidelines, and at their own cost. For customers who would like to move the meter, contacting a qualified electrician is the first step.

When customers request service from BC Hydro they agree to the terms and conditions in BC Hydro's Electric Tariff, including the obligation to provide access to their property so that we can read, maintain or exchange the BC Hydro meter.

#### Why is the Smart Metering Program Important?

Smart meters are a necessary part of B.C.'s electricity system. They are standard equipment just like utility poles and power lines and are required to modernize the system and ensure the safe, efficient delivery of electricity to British Columbians.

Smart meters are part of a system that will:

- automatically detect power outages;
- provide customers with access to their hourly electricity-use data through a secure online account;
- ensure bills are based on actual consumption; and
- improve safety by having installers inspect each meter socket that connects homes and businesses to the electricity grid, and provide free repairs by a qualified electrician on-thespot if an issue is found.

On behalf of the Council of the District of Houston, thank you for interest in our views on this important matter. Council will be sending a letter to the Minister of State (Finance) Ted Menzies and the Minister of State (Transport) Steven Fletcher expressing its opposition to the potential sale of Ridley Terminals.

We look forward to working together with other members of the NCLGA to support a united vision for a publicly owned Ridley Terminals that will continue to provide a strong foundation for our export industries and our communities.

Background: On October 1, 2012 Council agreed to put 4 of the Village owned lots up for sale (one of the 4 was awaiting Land titles transfer of title to Village name which was finalized on October 31, 2012). The new assessments for 2013 have now been received and the assessments on the 4 properties have not changed – this is significant in the fact that we would need to have a public meeting if we were considering selling lots below assessed value.

Recommendation: I recommend we initially advertise the 4 lots in the local Observer and on HG Trader for the months of Feb/Mar and see what results from that level of advertising (2 of the 4 lots already have some interest shown via phone and in person questions asked). We will re-assess the situation in April to determine if advertising broader afield is deemed necessary/financially sound. #### **Small Craft Harbour Committee**

Council wishes to create an ad hoc committee to investigate issues related to the Small Craft Harbour in Port Clements.

The goals of this committee include, but are not limited to:

- Investigating the need to improve water and sewer services to the Small Craft Harbour, and, if it
  is determined that improvement is required determining the most cost beneficial manner to do
  this
- Investigating options for reconfiguration of the SCH in order to accommodate additional water crafts and optimize usage
- Investigating the pros and cons of staying with the Small Craft Harbour Authority given its mandate for Commercial fishing and the actual use of the dock
- Determine if, and to what extent, any dredging is required in the SCH area
- Investigate and make recommendations for repairs and/or upgrades to the boat launch area

The committee will be responsible to create a work plan based on their findings and present this plan to Council. This report should indicate a timeline and, if possible, break the work into segments based on prioritizing each action.

The ad-hoc committee will be responsible to keep Minutes of their meetings and to keep Council, as a whole, apprised of their activities via quarterly updates at Regular Council meetings. This committee should have a minimum of two Council members on it and should seek out a minimum of two community members to also sit on the committee.

This ad-hoc committee will be in effect until December 16, 2013, at which time it will be re-evaluated to assess the progress made and determine if it needs to be extended for another year.
