Dear Mayor Wally Cheer and Council,

Communities in Skeena-Bulkley Valley, like those throughout rural and northern Canada, fuel Canada's economy with our natural resources, energy, agricultural products and raw materials that make up more than 50 per cent of our exports. Our communities and the resources found in the Northwest provide many millions in annual tax revenue, growth in urban Canada and reinvestible entrepreneurial profit.

From my discussions with many of you throughout the years, aging infrastructure, shrinking populations and tax bases compound infrastructure deficits and make providing the basic services and facilities more onerous. Canada's infrastructure deficit, calculated as the total investments required for maintaining and replacing decaying municipal infrastructure, has ballooned to \$171 billion. With municipalities receiving only 8 cents of every tax dollar, it is obvious the federal government must take a leadership role.

The federal 2013 budget will soon be upon us. Working together with the excellent team from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, my New Democratic colleagues and I, especially Olivia Chow our Transport and Infrastructure Critic, were able to persuade the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to commit to announcing a new Infrastructure plan in this coming budget. This is incredibly important because, as you know, the existing program is expiring and municipalities will miss a construction season if the new program is not in place this year.

I hope you will join with me in pushing for a new infrastructure fund that:

- has a twenty years cycle instead of two. It is impossible to complete serious projects like highways rebuilt or waste water plants in two years.
- takes politics out of the funding process by being accountable, transparent and nonpartisan. Clear-cut funding formulas like per-capita allocations will ensure reliable, predictable funding for municipalities.

The time for the federal government to act is now. With 11,000 jobs being created for every \$1 billion in infrastructure investments, job growth and economic productivity hinge upon a well-designed federal infrastructure program. It is a crucial opportunity that we cannot afford to waste.

Greetings,

Commencing today, February 14, 2013, the District is running a 90 day comment period for road users to review Forest Service Roads planned for permanent deactivation. This email is in addition to hard copy letters that have been sent out to key stakeholder groups on this date.

In 2003, the Forestry Revitalization Act (Bill 28) reallocated a portion of Western Forest Products Inc. harvesting rights on Haida Gwaii to create new opportunities for First Nations, Community Forests and Woodlot Licenses.

The area was removed from Western Forest Products Tree Farm License and added to the Timber Supply Area. During the reallocation process, the roads included in the reallocation areas were transferred from Western Forest Products Road Permits to District Manager Forest Service Roads. As new tenure holders were assigned operating areas, they identified the roads required to access planned harvesting operations.

The process of reallocating areas to new tenure holders and the associated transfer of roads are nearing completion. The end result is the identification of roads that are not required for, or are surplus to, industrial activity. Surplus roads are located in the following operating areas:

Surplus Forest Service Roads - Operating Areas

- Dinan Bay
- Ferguson (Canyon/Drill/East Yak)
- Skidegate (Skowkona QC127)
- Alliford (Haans Creek)
- Survey Creek
- Lakes Main

The Ministry has established this comment period to provide an opportunity for stakeholders to review the surplus roads and identify any additional roads that should remain open and maintained for industrial activity.

The Ministry does not have the ability to maintain surplus roads. If any stakeholders identify roads that should remain open and be maintained, the Ministry can reassign the maintenance obligations to them through the issuance of an applicable tenure. Roads which are not reassigned to new tenures will be scheduled for permanent deactivation.

Roads which are not reassigned to new tenures will be schedule for permanent deactivation.

The opportunity to comment will expire on May 27, 2013. Permanent deactivation works will be scheduled to commence in June 2013.

In addition to this notice, the Haida Gwaii Natural Resource District will be hosting an Open House to provide stakeholders the opportunity to view maps and submit comments on the proposed road deactivations. The Open House is scheduled for **Wednesday** February 27, 2013 from 12:00 pm to 8:00 pm, at the Queen Charlotte Community Hall in the Eric Ross Room.

The attached overview map shows the general location of the road networks in question. re: BCTS DISPUTE RESOLUTION DISCUSSION

Dear Wally Cheer and Council:

This letter is in response to your request to explore the dispute resolution process between the Village of Port Clements and BCTS Chinook. I assume this request arises as your council has had discussions with Taan Forest Ltd. (Taan) about their dispute resolution process when they completed consultation on the FSC Management Plan.

I am not sure if you are aware but the public consultation that Taan completes on the FSC Management Plan is also conducted on behalf of BCTS as BCTS is a Group Member of the FSC certificate. Taan, as the Group Leader, is responsible for the public consultation on the FSC Management Plan for all the Group Members. BCTS as a Group Member of the FSC certificate is then bound to follow the FSC Management Plan which in this particular case includes the Dispute Resolution Process.



In this letter I will provide a very brief summary of details of the FSC Management Plan and the dispute resolution process that it contains. The full text of the management plan is available at the following link:

The Management Plan describes how Taan and BCTS will conduct their corporate activities to ensure their activities comply with the Forest Stewardship Council's BC Standard as a Type 1 group. Key elements of the plan include; the scope of the plan, a description of the management units, a statement of the rate of harvest, the public consultation process, and forest management objectives and strategies. The Management Plan also includes a section that describes the Dispute Resolution Process that will be followed by group members.

Once the formal public consultation process has been exhausted, a community member or organization may launch a complaint if they feel that forest management activities impact their rights or interests. The complainant may register a complaint with the Group Member, BCTS or the Group Manager, Taan.

The dispute resolution process follows the following basic format. A record of complaint is submitted in writing by the complainant stating the issue. The management plan also makes a commitment that, where a complaint is received orally or over the phone, the organization receiving the complaint will attempt to investigate. The complaint is documented and returned to the complainant to ensure documentation is accurate and the complaint is characterized adequately. The receiving organization will then consult the Group Manager, Taan, and designate the organization and staff member responsible for resolution. The assigned organization will then investigate the complaint and work toward resolution of the issue with the complainant.

Complaints break out into two categories, Dispute and Grievance, under the management plan.

Dispute

A Dispute is a formal complaint to a group member such as BCTS around the impacts of BCTS forest management practices. Disputes do not involve claims for damages or compensation. A dispute will be investigated by the Group Member and its staff.

In this case, BCTS will work with the disputant to reach resolution. Where the parties cannot reach agreement they may choose to seek mediation and the mediator will facilitate an agreement. If the two parties cannot agree on an acceptable mediator the Group Manager may appoint a mediator and the mediator may, at their discretion, engage professional advisors to provide advice on resolution

Grievance

A Grievance is a formal written notice which alleges the management activities of a group member affect the property, resources, livelihoods, or legal or customary rights of the Griever and which requests damages or compensation be paid to the griever.

Taan, as the Group Manager, will manage the resolution of a Grievance. If resolution cannot be reached the Grievance will be resolved with binding arbitration. An arbitrator can be selected mutually by the Group Manager and the Griever or by the Group Manager alone if mutual agreement cannot be reached.

If the process identifies compensation in the form of restoration, mitigation or damages in the form of financial payment is required for the loss or damage, the assigned party will correct the damage and / or pay the agreed damages and costs of the arbitration.

Outside of the FSC Management Plan there are also avenues that an individual or organization may take to seek resolution of a dispute. Dispute resolution is available through the Certifying Body Dispute Resolution Procedures or the Forest Stewardship Council under their Dispute Resolution process. In addition complaints may also be lodged with the Compliance and Enforcement Branch of FLNRO, the Forest Practices Board or the BC Ombudsman in the case of complaints against government.

If you have any further questions or wish to discuss more detailed aspects of the dispute resolution process please do not hesitate to call.
