Dear Council Members

The Port Clements Historical Society is grateful for the Village's financial support in the past and hopes to be a recipient of your support again in 2012. Your support is urgently needed to keep our museum operational. As you are aware, the museum is a vital component of our community and the grant from the Village enables us to operate year round. Our paid attendance to the museum in 2011 was 1,623 and, we believe, 2012 should bring more visitors to us.

We are continually striving to make the Port Clements museum more historically relevant and vital to keeping the Island's history alive as well as continually maintaining the equipment and artifacts on exhibit. Although we were able to do substantial work on our exhibits last year, there is still much more work to be done this year. We have two new exhibits this year which require substantial work to make them available for viewing. Local students or local people are usually hired to do this work for us as well as our employment of two people to work in the museum during the summer months.

Additionally, we have identified a need to install drainage on the museum grounds and we are currently getting some local people to look at it and tell us the best way to accomplish this. With our limited funding, we are challenged to getting this done. This is another reason your support is needed.

I have attached a copy of our budget for this year as well as our financial statements for the last year. We are asking for a grant from the Village of \$2,800.00 which is the amount granted last year and which helped us remain operational and effective.

PORT CLEMENTS HISTORICAL SOCIETY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UNAUDITED - SEE NOTICE TO READER) SEPTEMBER 30, 2011

1. Purpose of organization

The Port Clements Historical Society operates a museum in Port Clements, BC. The Society is funded by operating grants from the Skeena Queen Charlotte Regional District and the Village of Port Clemens. The Port Clements Historical Society is incorporated under the Canada Corporations Act as a not-for-profit organization and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

2. Significant accounting policies

Revenue Recognition

The Port Clements Historical Society follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Restricted investment income is recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted investment income is recognized as revenue when earned.

Capital assets

Purchased capital assets are recorded at cost. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the time of the contribution. Amortization is not provided. Artifact acquisitions are expensed when acquired and are not capitalized.

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REPORT TO COUNCIL

RE: NCLGA Conference

DATE: May 10, 2012

REPORT BY: Wally Cheer

Matt and I arrived in 100 Mile House on Wednesday afternoon and registered for the conference when we arrived. We attended a welcome reception at 108 Mile Heritage Site that evening but skipped the Enbridge reception.

We sat in on the opening ceremonies Thursday morning and listened to the resolutions and debate. At lunch, Vaughn Palmer, political reporter for the Vancouver Sun and Province gave the audience an hour long speech about the political landscape in Victoria today and discussed the possible outcomes of a provincial election.

That afternoon we sat in on a bioenergy presentation. Matt attended a presentation on carbon offsets and fuel efficiencies while I took part in a delegation meeting with Northern Health regarding issues with hospitals in northwest B. C.

On Friday morning, Matt participated in a workshop on BC Jobs Plan while I attended a workshop on Integrated Community Sustainability Planning in Rural BC. Later in the morning, Ida Chong, Minister of Community, Sport and Culture talked to the audience about grant programs for communities and why some grant applications were better than others. She also talked about sustainability in communities. This was followed by an unplanned visit and speech by Premier Christie Clark. Her focus was the mining industry in British Columbia. Later in the morning we sat in on NDI's presentation to the convention.

Tod Maffin talked to the audience at lunch about the value of Facebook and Twitter for elected officials. He detailed the advantages of the medium as well as the pitfalls and dangers which can be encountered. His hour long talk was full of humour and very insightful.

After lunch on Friday, Matt attended a workshop on Community and Economic Change while I attended a workshop on Impact of Climate Change on Natural Areas. These workshops were followed by a Forestry Panel Discussion about forests in B. C. and new products developed within the industry.
