BOARD HIGHLIGHTS January 20, 2017 Board Meeting

Delegations:

Janine North, Economic Director for the Misty Isles Economic Development Society (MIEDS) addressed the Board with respect to MIEDS' work plan for 2017. Ms. North noted that there has been progress made on the Haida Gwaii Community Forest project with the Council of the Haida Nation lending its support to the initiative. Destination marketing will be another key project for MIEDS in 2017, as it will be marketing Haida Gwaii on a global-scale. It is anticipated that grant funding for the destination marketing project will be largely sourced from Destination BC. MIEDS will continue to work with small business on Haida Gwaii to support the Love Haida Gwaii and Go Haida Gwaii websites.

Ms. North responded to questions posed by the Board.

The Chair thanked Ms. North for her presentation.

Board Business:

- 1. The Board received correspondence from Reconciliation Canada with respect to the Reconciliation Dialogue Workshop taking place in Prince Rupert, B.C. on February 2nd, 2017.
- The Board received correspondence from BC Ferry Services Inc. with respect to Route 11 sailings and BC Ferries commitment to investigate the feasibility of operating 2.5 sailings per week during the winter and shoulder season.
- 3. The Board received a report from staff with the completed Regional Recycling Facility Asset Management Plan. The Board referred the report to the Regional Recycling Advisory Committee and will consider recommendations from the report in its upcoming financial planning.
- 4. The Board resolved to support the North Coast Regional District's application to Northern Development Initiative Trust's Marketing Initiatives Program in the amount of \$20,000 to be used to support a rebranding project.
- 5. The Board received a report from staff outlining the engagement process followed in the development of the North Coast Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 608, 2017. The Board gave first reading to the proposed bylaw and scheduled a public hearing for February 16, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. in Prince Rupert, B.C.
- 6. The Board resolved to support the Edge of the World Music Festival Society's application to Northern Development Initiative Trust's Fabulous Festivals and Events program in the amount of \$2,500.
- 7. The Board held its first round of financial planning discussions on January 21, 2017.

This letter is in response to the Village of Port Clements's request of January 24, 2017, to deem the remaining council members to be a quorum.

Please find enclosed a Minister's Order under section 129(3)(a) of the *Community Charter* which authorizes that together the two remaining council members on the Village of Port Clements Council constitute a quorum until the vacancies on Council are filled in the upcoming by-election and the new council holds their first meeting.

It is my understanding that before it lost quorum, Council had already appointed a Chief Election Officer and set the date for the by-election as March 25, 2017.

Given the need for a Ministerial Order, I would expect that Council's focus until the first meeting of the new council will be on its statutory obligations and actions necessary to deliver and maintain services to Village of Port Clements citizens. In this regard, I would suggest that until the council vacancies have been filled through by-election, Council not set any overall strategic or policy directions or take new decisions which could create legal or financial liabilities for the Village.

Recap from meeting with Gwaii Communications January 31, 2017

I met with Mark Halwa and Jeff Lavoie in regards to Gwaii Communications' plan to apply for funding to expand and improve their internet offerings on Haida Gwaii.

In December the Federal Government announced funding to provide internet to rural and remote areas. In addition, Northern Development Initiative Trust still has some funding left from the Province for this type of project and finally, the CRTC also announced their stance on interconnectivity and it is expected that sometime later in 2017 additional funding may become available through them to help rural areas meet their mandate.

Gwaii Communications will be applying in February to Northern Development Initiative Trust and in March to the Federal Government for funding to provide last mile connectivity. For clarity, Gwaii Tel provides the back bone infrastructure for the islands and the ISP providers provide internet to the customers. Gwaii Communications will include Port Clements in their activities if they are successful in their funding applications. Per the power point presentation attached to this recap you can see that their goal is to provide a service level of 100Mps up/down (page 2), renew their agreement with Gwaii Tel to stream line the process of providing internet island wide (page 5) and remove bandwidth charges from their billings (page 5).

Gwaii Communications is requesting a letter of support from the Village of Port Clements Council for each of their applications to NDIT and Federal Government.
