# Bill C-628 An Act to Defend the Pacific Northwest BACKGROUNDER

Background: The Act to Defend the Pacific Northwest is a bill designed to fully and finally stop the Enbridge Northern Gateway pipeline in its tracks. The bill will also change the work of the National Energy Board toward a process that respects communities and First Nations, and puts Canadian energy security first. Inspired, in part, by the experience of Northwest BC and our fight against the Enbridge Northern Gateway pipeline, Nathan's bill would legislate immediate protection for BC's pristine North Coast from the threat of oil tankers, while addressing key concerns raised by the poor process that led the Conservative government to approve the pipeline. Stephen Harper's Conservatives have shut out communities and First Nations from the conversation, and failed to look at the long-term economic and environmental impacts of runaway "rip-and-ship" development.

**North Coast tanker ban:** Nathan's bill would finally ban supertankers from transporting oil across the North Coast of British Columbia for the first time in history. This region is one of the most environmentally, culturally and historically important areas in our country – and some of the most difficult waters in the world, with waves up to 26 metres high and winds up to 185km/h. This bill is also an opportunity for all Members of Parliament, especially those from British Columbia, to stand up against Enbridge's pipeline and to Ottawa's bullying tactics to send 11,000 supertankers through these sensitive and important waters.

Making the NEB more accountable: The Harper government has taken away the voice of the people who will be most impacted by pipeline projects in Canada. Thousands of people wrote letters and testified before the Northern Gateway joint review panel, municipalities and the province of British Columbia formally declared their opposition, and 130 First Nations signed a declaration opposing Northern Gateway, only to have their views virtually ignored by the Harper Conservatives. Nathan's bill would make the National Energy Board more accountable for ensuring adequate consultation occurs between the federal government and First Nations, provincial and municipal governments, and local communities impacted by a proposed project – and for ensuring the concerns raised by Canadians are reflected in the Board's final decisions. Bill C-628 will complement the significant Supreme Court decisions that have strengthened rights and title for First Nations people.

Energy security: Review panels assessing pipeline proposals are not presently required to consider the impacts of projects on jobs and energy security in Canada. Exporting raw bitumen, as is the case under the Northern Gateway proposal, does not only mean shipping our raw resources to foreign jurisdictions with weaker environmental standards. It also means shipping out potential tax revenues, as well as Canadian jobs and energy security. Bill C-628 would give the National Energy Board a mandate to assess the impacts of proposed pipelines on employment in Canada's upgrading and refining sectors, and ask it to consider whether a pipeline project will add value to natural resources in Canada as part of its public interest criteria. Bill C-628 also complements Nathan's advocacy for a stronger green economy, and the NDP's commitments to implementing a "polluter-pay" model, putting a price on carbon, and eliminating the \$1.3 billion subsidy to the oil industry.

#### **BYLAW NO.420, 2015**

# A bylaw to provide for various procedures for the conduct of local government elections and assent voting.

WHEREAS under the *Local Government Act*, Council may, by bylaw, determine various procedures and requirements to be applied to the conduct of local government elections and assent voting;

AND WHEREAS Council wishes to establish voting procedures and requirements under that authority;

NOW THEREFORE, the Village of Port Clements Council, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

#### 1. ADVANCE VOTING OPPORTUNITIES

a) In accordance with Section 97(3) of the *Local Government Act*, a second advance voting opportunity will not be held.

#### 2. MAIL BALLOT VOTING

- a) As authorized under Section 100 of the *Local Government Act*, voting may be done by mail for those electors who meet the criteria in paragraph (b)
- b) The following electors are permitted to vote by mail ballot:
  - i) those persons who have a physical disability, illness or injury that affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity;
  - ii) persons who expect to be absent from Port Clements on general voting day AND for advance voting;
- c) The following procedures for voting MUST apply:
  - i) sufficient records will be kept by the Chief Elections officer so that challenges of the

- elector's right to vote may be made in accordance with the intent of Section 116 of the Local Government Act;
- ii) a person exercising the right to vote by mail under the provisions of Section 100 may be challenged in accordance with, and on the grounds specified in Section 116 of the *Local Government Act*, until 4:30pm two days before general voting day.
- d) The following application procedure must be adhered to:
  - i) Following the Declaration of Election by vote but at least 14 days prior to the General voting date, a person wishing to vote by mail ballot shall submit an "Application to Vote by Mail" to the Chief Elections officer (exhibit A).
  - ii) Upon receipt of an "Application to Vote by Mail" the Chief Elections Officer or designate shall, as soon as ballot packages are available but no later than 10 days prior to General voting date, make available to the applicant a mail ballot package.
  - iii) Record the name, residential address, and in the case of a non-resident property elector, the address of the property in relation to which they are voting, for the "vote by mail" applicant and, upon request, make available for inspection the list containing said information.
  - iv) Completed mail in ballots MUST BE received by the Chief Elections Officer or designate by 8pm on the general voting day. The Village of Port Clements is not responsible for mail delivery problems which delay the receipt of the mail in ballot.
  - v) To vote using a mail ballot, the elector shall mark the ballot in accordance with the instructions contained in the mail ballot package provided. After marking the ballot the elector shall place the ballot in the secrecy envelope provided and seal the envelope. They then place the secrecy envelope in the certification envelope and complete and sign the certification printed on the envelope and then seal the certification envelope. Finally the certification envelope is

- placed in the outer envelope which is then sealed and mailed or delivered to the Chief Elections Officer or designate at the address specified so that it is received no later than 8pm on general voting day.
- vi) Upon receipt the Chief Elections Officer or designate shall record the date of receipt and open the outer envelope to examine the certification envelope. If satisfied as to the identity and entitlement to vote of the elector, and that the requirements of Section 55 of the Local Government Act have been fulfilled shall mark the certification envelope as accepted, open it in the presence of at least one other person and place the secrecy envelopes into a ballot box.
- vii) If the Chief Election Officer or designate is not satisfied with the identity of the elector, or if the envelope is received after 8pm on general election date, the certification envelope shall remain unopened and the envelope will be marked rejected noting the reason for rejection and the ballot shall not be counted in the election. Unopened envelopes shall be subject to the provisions of Section 150(6) of the Local Government Act with regards to their destruction.
- viii) Where, upon receiving a mailed in ballot, the Chief Elections Officer or designate determines that another person by the same name has voted, the provisions of Section 117 of the *Local Government Act* shall apply, so far as applicable.

#### 3. RESOLUTION OF TIE VOTE(S) AFTER JUDICIAL RECOUNT

a) In the event of a tie vote after a judicial recount, the tie vote will be resolved by conducting a lot in accordance with Section 141 of the Local Government Act.

This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Elections and Asset Voting Bylaw #420, 2015".

A Bylaw of the Village of Port Clements to repeal Bylaws #127, 130, 198, 201, 207, 222, 233, 241, 262, 332, 346.

The Council for the Village of Port Clements in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

#### WHEREAS:

A. The Village of Port Clements (the "Municipality") deems it desirable and necessary to repeal Bylaw Numbers; 127 – Tax Exemption Bylaw, 130 – Additional Municipal Officers Bylaw, 198 – Economic Development Advisory Bylaw, 201 – Interest Rate Setting Bylaw, 207 – Economic Development Advisory Amendment Bylaw, 222 – Tax Sale Reserve Fund Establishment Bylaw, 233 – Economic Development Advisory Amendment Bylaw, 241 – Garbage Dump Establishment Bylaw, 262 – Amendment to Garbage Dump Establishment Bylaw, 332 – Public Works Commission Bylaw, 346 – Multipurpose Building Construction Committee Bylaw;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council for the Village of Port Clements in open meeting assembled, **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS**:

- 1. This Bylaw may be cited as "The Village of Port Clements Repeal Bylaw No. 421, 2015". This Bylaw repeals the following Bylaws:
  - a) #127 Tax Exemption Bylaw
  - b) #130 Additional Municipal Officers Bylaw
  - c) #198 Economic Development Advisory Bylaw
  - d) #201 Interest Rate Setting Bylaw
  - e) #207 Economic Development Advisory Amendment Bylaw
  - f) #222 Tax Sale Reserve Fund Establishment Bylaw
  - g) #233 Economic Development Advisory Amendment Bylaw
  - h) #241 Garbage Dump Establishment Bylaw
  - i) #262 Amendment to Garbage Dump Establishment Bylaw
  - j) #332 Public Works Commission
  - k) #346 Multipurpose Building Construction Committee Bylaw

#### Back up information to Bylaw #421, 2015

Listed below are the reasons for repealing the bylaws listed in Bylaw #421. Basically it is a housekeeping issue. Most of the Bylaws that this Bylaw references can be found on our website in case you wish to review the exact wording/purpose of the old bylaw. Bylaws #127, 198, 207 and 233 are not on the website. I expect that when the Bylaws were initially being set up on our website the person doing the work realized that although these bylaws had never formally been repealed, they were no longer valid bylaws. If you wish to see the wording for any of these bylaws I can either email them to you or you can come into the office and view the original documents.

- #127 This Bylaw from 1982 (about granting a tax exemption to Cedarview Church) was replaced by Bylaw #252 which had a built in expiry date of 2003.
- #130 This Bylaw from 1982 was creating the position of Deputy Clerk in the office but it was replaced by Bylaw #333.
- #198 This Bylaw from 1988 was to create an Economic Development Commission. It was replaced by Bylaw #349.
- #201 This Bylaw from 1989 was to establish an interest rate for latecomer fees. This issue has already been concluded.
- #207 This bylaw from 1989 was an amendment to Bylaw #198 which is replaced by Bylaw #349.
- #222 This Bylaw from 1990 was to establish a reserve fund from tax sale proceeds. It references sections of the Local Government Act which were repealed over a decade ago so it has reference flaws. In addition, this issue is now covered by the Community Charter.
- #233 This Bylaw from 1991 was an amendment to Bylaw #198 which is replaced by Bylaw #349.
- #241 This Bylaw from 1994 was to establish a dump service. We no longer operate a dump this is now the Regional District's responsibility so the bylaw is no longer applicable.
- #2 62 This Bylaw from 1994 was to set fees for the dump service hence it is no longer applicable.
- #3 32 This Bylaw from 2003 was to establish a Public Works Commission. The activities outlined in this bylaw are no longer in effect.
- #3 46 This Bylaw from 2004 was to establish the Multipurpose Building Committee. This task is complete so this committee is no longer required.

Section 129 of the *Community Charter* allows the Village to apply for an order from the court if there is a loss of quorum due to disclosure of conflict:

129

- (4) The municipality may apply to the Supreme Court for an order under subsection (5) if, as a result of section 100 [disclosure of conflict], the number of council members who may discuss and vote on a matter falls below
  - (a) the quorum for the council, or
  - (b) the number of council members required to adopt the applicable bylaw or resolution.
- (5) On an application under subsection (4), the court may
  - (a) order that all or specified council members may discuss and vote on the matter, despite sections 100 [disclosure of conflict] and 101 [restrictions on participation], and
  - (b) make the authority under paragraph (a) subject to any conditions and directions the court considers appropriate.
- (6) An application under subsection (4) may be made without notice to any other person.

We would be pleased to seek an order from the B.C. Supreme Court on behalf of Council, which will allow a vote on this matter to proceed.

**Janitorial Contract** 

Background: In 2014 we entered into a two year Janitorial Contract with Shirley Weigum which concludes in August 2016. The contract is for a flat monthly price based on a list of duties outlined in the contract. Recently there has been a change in usage in the Multiplex (increase in hours for the Vancouver Island Regional Library – specifically being open on Saturdays) which is resulting in approximately 1.25 hours per week more work for Shirley due to increased cleaning requirements (washrooms and hallways). The contract has a clause that says \$20/hour for additional work but that was anticipated to cover unusual one off events not something that is going to happen consistently for the remainder of her contract.

Recommendation: In light of this material change in her work I recommend that we amend her monthly contract fee from \$1100/month to \$1175/month to the end of the contract.

# **Public Works Report to Council**

March 16, 2015

#### Sewer

- No emergencies or out of the ordinary maintenance to report.
- Had a site visit at the sewage lagoon with Tom Robinson, P Eng., of Associated Engineering, who is working on a federally funded feasibility study of Old Masset and Skidegate's sewage facilities, in specific about the effect of possible desludging of their lagoons. Tom will do some preliminary work including Port Clements facility in this study.
- There has been no report back on the progress of the application for transitional authorization submitted to the Effluent Regulatory Reporting Information System in compliance with the Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations.

#### **Community Park**

• Awaiting guidance from Rec commission and council as to what upgrades to carry forward with this year. Signage and improvements to the playground are most likely. Oldest bleachers, which are a hazard, are being removed.

#### Millennium Park & St. Marks

• Nothing major planned except for standard spring cleaning. PW would like direction from tourism committee and council regarding keypad entry. (Old action item)

#### **Shoreline Park and Sunset Campground**

- A major water leak was located in Sunset Park underneath a
  pedestrian bridge. Water to the RV side has been shut down and
  signage has been put in place. To be repaired before campground
  opens. Small possibility that bridge or bridge approaches will need to
  be rebuilt after the repair.
- Spring cleanup has commenced with chipping and cleanup of winter blow down in campsite and trail. The one snowstorm this winter created more than average mess.

#### **Streets (Industrial Road)**

- PW will continue to maintain the road by spot filling potholes as required. A grading has been requested, subject to availability of local contractor's equipment schedule.
- Small amount of machine brushing of alders and ditching is still required.

#### **Staff**

- Currently transitioning from having an experienced and knowledgeable, certified assistant to a new hire. Much of the duties of the previous Public Works Assistant now has to be 'relearned' by both myself and the new assistant, Oliver Bell.
- Hoping for an equivalent amount of funding this spring and summer so as to aid in placing a summer student to help out with grounds keeping and other projects.

#### Water

• Verbal review of recent boil water notice, conditions leading up to this event and actions taken to rescind and prevent any similar event in the future.

 Progress on a start to a pigging program have been delayed due to BWN, Public Works is working towards beginning this program.
 Verbal discussion of risks and possible benefits, as well as a longer range plan.

#### **Biomass Project**

- Currently assisting engineers with finalizing a formal site plan for the placement of the container and fuel feed system, as well as critical underground locates before the commencement of any trenching or ground disturbance.
- Consensus indicates that the final location of the finished project will be located 'somewhere' on the site of the old municipal office.

LGMA Webinar: Municipal - Audited Annual Financial Statements

This webinar was presented by NG Consulting. It consisted of four afternoon sessions totalling six hours of training. Attention is drawn to the fact that Municipal Accounting is about services and redistribution of wealth – NOT about making money. The presenter defined the purpose and meaning of the statements referencing "PSAB" (Public Sector Accounting Board) and "GAAP" (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles); clarifying the need for the Auditor's approach to be through application of "professional judgement" based on the specifics of the municipality.

Explanation was given to details such as how to interpret the numbers in relation to determining the overall state of a municipality, drawing attention to the variables that affect the overall picture. An understanding was given as to what could make up certain line items i.e. 'Investment Income', and that interpretation of assets is represented as financial and non-financial. Other areas discussed were Notes, Tangible Capital Assets, Amortization, and the appropriate areas to present both summarized information and expanded information.

In summary, the following was covered:

- Audit Report
- Statement of Financial Position or Balance Sheet
- Statement of Operations
- Schedules and Financial Notes
- Municipal Accounting Formula: Assets = Liabilities + Accumulated Surplus

It is my opinion that this webinar was a beneficial investment in training, as it provided informative details that aided in connecting my current knowledge base in municipal accounting.
