Emergency Management—who is responsible for what

Emergency Management is a joint effort. Below is an abbreviated explanation of the various responsibilities:

Federal Government—responsible for national emergencies including internal and external threats to security. Provides assistance to Provincial Government on request.

Provincial Government—establishes roles and responsibilities for provincial government and local authorities (municipalities, regional districts and treaty First Nations). Provides extra-ordinary powers to the provincial government and/or local authorities where required. Provides Disaster Financial Assistance under specific circumstances. Exempts emergency service workers from civil liability.

Local Authority—must establish and maintain an emergency organization including creating and updating local emergency plans. May delegate some of their powers to individuals and committees as required.

Businesses—WorksafeBC requires that employers establish emergency preparedness and response procedures, equipment and training specific for their workplace.

Individuals—At a MINIMUM individuals need to strive for 3 full days of food, water and supplies for your household. This should be kept somewhere convenient and ready to go in case the emergency requires immediate evacuation. The 3 day recommendation is only an estimate so it may be longer—are you prepared? A By-Election was required due to the Mayor and 2 councillors resigning their positions. Nominations were submitted in February. There were 2 nominations for Mayor and 2 nominations for Councillor, Both Elizabeth "Betty" Stewart and Brigid Cumming were made Councillors by Acclamation. Urs Thomas and Chris Bellamy had been nominated for Mayor. On March 15th, 2017 the By-Election polls closed with 127 ballots cast. Urs Thomas received 68 votes, Chris Bellamy received 58 votes and there was one spoilt ballot. Please welcome the new Mayor Urs Thomas and Councillors Brigid Cumming & Betty Stewart. 2017 Taxes & Home Owner's Grant

Taxes for the 2017 year will be coming through the mail before the end of the month. Please note: if you are eligible for the Home Owner Grant you need to fill it out and return it to the office no later than July 3rd at 4:00 pm. To avoid interest penalties (10% of taxes), pay your taxes before this date.

Please note that you must complete your Home Owner's Grant application annually and it is only available for your primary residence. Also, if you are paying your property taxes through your mortgage or financial institute, you must still fill out the form and submit it to receive the grant.

TAX DEFERMENT PROGRAM

If you require assistance with paying your taxes, the Provincial Government has a few property tax deferment programs that may fit your needs.

Store it don't Pour it!

Did you know that Village of Port Clements Public Works monitors public sewer and drinking water every day? Checks are being made throughout our utilities infrastructure to maintain and observe potential issues. Sometimes what we find is unsettling such as a glass eye in a sewer lift station. Lately, however, nothing quite so strange was discovered. VoPC



public works staff has noticed an increased volume of fat type deposits in the public sewer system. The public works department would like all of the villagers to be mindful of what goes down the drain. We can all benefit from ensuring our public sewer system is healthy. Fat from cooking is the leading cause of plumbing problems in your home and in the public system. Especially bad are lard, tallow, and deer fat. Pouring fats down your sink is like throwing money down the drain! Fats, oils, and grease can cause sewer backups by blocking the main sewer lines as well as those on private property, causing expensive property damage. The public cost of repairing a damaged sewer can be astronomical. The Village is

asking everyone to "store it, don't pour it". Residents are asked to store fats and grease in disposable containers with lids. This simple act is the best preventative maintenance we can all participate in. The containers can then be placed in the garbage. Thanks for participating!

"Myth Busters"

Please do not pour grease then chase with lots of soap and hot water. This is ineffective in the long term and quite environmentally harmful.
