

# WINTER ROAD TRIPS COURTESY O'BRIEN

Winter weather is hard on your vehicle, here are some tips to make sure it is up to the challenge:

Watch for posted agendas for

- 1. Install winter tires—use 4 matched winter tires that carry the winter tire logo—even if you are driving a 4X4.
- 2. Get your car winter ready with a mainte-nance check-up.
- Change your wiper
   blades to winter
   blades—they are heavier
   and push snow and ice
   easier.
- 4. Clear snow and ice from

all windows, lights, mirros, hood and the roof.

ROAD & BRIDGE

- Make sure your windshield washer reservoir is full and carry extra washer fluid in your vehicle.
- 6. Be prepared by packing a winter survival kit including things such as non-perishable food, blankets, first aid supplies, flares, matches or lighter, gloves, shovel, sand or kitty litter, flashlight and extra batteries, jumper cables, spare tire, wheel wrench and jack, extra clothing and footwear and sand bags for weight.
- 7. Keep your gas tank topped up. This helps avoid condensation and moist air on the inside of the tank, which can cause fuel lines to freeze and other serious issues.
- 8. If you get stuck in a storm, don't panic. Avoid overexertion and overexposure. Stay in your vehicle and open your window slightly to make sure you have a supply of fresh air. Use a survival candle for heat. Set out a warning light or flares.

## VANDALISM

Vandalism—damage such as graffiti and defacement directed towards any property without permission of the owner.

What can we do to help curb vandalism in Port Clements?

- \*\*\*Report all vandalism to the police—vandalism is the largest unreported crime in Canada and costs property owners, tax payers and insurance companies approximately \$100 million dollars per year across the country.\*\*\*
- keep areas well lit
- report suspicious actions near homes, schools, vacant buildings, businesses or other structure.
- ask neighbours to keep watch over your home if you are going to be away
- lock your doors, including sheds and garages and ensure items, such as bicycles, are secured

Did you know:

- parents of children under 16 years of age can be held liable for their children's actions
- Vandalism is a criminal act that falls under "mischief" and can lead to imprisonment
- A conviction under the Criminal Code can affect a person's right to practice a trade or profession

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
