Mayor Daugert: Attended the COTW and special meeting of council. Attended the weekly meetings with Northern Health and answered that increased testing would not be beneficial because it requires time to culture the tests. This type of testing is going to continue to be used only for Health Essential Service Workers. Attended MIEDS AGM meeting — MIEDS is looking at assisting with business in light of the impacts of COVID-19. No news on the Community Forest. Attending the lidstone restart, protocol group meeting, attending meetings with Minister Robinson & Farnworth, will also attend NCRD and NWRH. Recommend Council give a thorough read of the CWPP.

Councillor Kish: Attended the COTW and the Special Meeting of Council.

Councillor Gould: Forwarded a letter from VIRL to staff. Do not expect any services before June 1, 2020. We still have the coordinator position and going to have a discussion with the working group about the position.

Councillor Cumming: Haida Gwaii Community Futures has been hosting weekly small business calls via zoom. Keeping small businesses in the loop re: Covid-19. Attended Special Meeting of Council and the COTW.

Councillor Falconbridge: Did not make the COTW attended the Special Meeting of Council.

CAO Decock: Electrical work on Well #2 has been finalized. Public works is continuing to work on connecting Well #3 and expect to have RFP's/RFQ's for the work to start in July /August. I have been informed that the Rainbow Wharf was reviewed by a biologist and it is looking hopeful that the work can be completed during the fish window in July/August. EOC is still open at level 1 and continue to work with Unified Command regarding travel restrictions and the permitting process. We are continuing to meet weekly. There is still a lot of unknowns regarding how municipalities can open public spaces and we will be attending more information sessions with the Local Government Association and the Municipal Insurance Association. Still unknown if we can safely open the

Multiplex Building and we are looking at working with the Port Clements Elementary School and Vancouver Island Regional Library.

11. QUESTIONS FROM THE PUBLIC & PRESS

Karissa Gall: Essential Workers are required to self-isolate for 14 days?

Answer: Please refer to the wording from the update to the CHN website.

Karissa Gall: Does \$338,000 from the NCPG, is that going to be directed to the Sewer Lagoon Expansion Project or how is that going to move forward?

Answer: There is some discussion with Council that needs to be addressed. There is no end of projects but a manner of approach to plan for the use of this money.

Karissa Gall: How is the money being received and what will be the planned use?

Answer: The NCPG must be spent on planning and capital expenses. It cannot be used for operational expenses.

Karissa Gall: Regarding potentially restarting again – my understanding is that the comments will be given back to Unified Command. Is there something like a plan going forward with the restart plan?

Answer: We will get more of an indication after the Protocol meeting and after the Meeting with the Minister. Whatever transpires it would be on the advice of Unified Command.

Question: Parents with children are concerned that communications from SD50 and Unified Command do not address Schools reopening on June 1st
