### Emergency Support Services

Port Clements' Volunteer Emergency Support Services is looking for more volunteers.

#### What does Emergency Support Services (ESS) do?

During an emergency ESS provides short-term services (generally up to 72 hours) to preserve the emotional and physical wellbeing of evacuees. This assistance includes providing food, lodging, clothing, emotional support, and family reunification.

#### What do ESS Volunteers do?

ESS volunteers help plan and provide assistance and direction to evacuees in the event of a disaster. The team forms the backbone of emergency services.

If you are interested in joining the team, come to an ESS meeting.

# What's New in Port Clements: Grants & Projects



## Firehall Re-envelope Project: COMPLETE



The Firehall re-envelope project has been completed. The Firehall has been refreshed with a new colour scheme as well.



## Housing Needs Assessment Grant

The Village has received a 100% funded grant for its housing needs assessment. Work is ongoing and will be completed July 2020.

## Community Wildfire Protection Plan

The Village has received a grant through the Union of British Columbia Municipalities (UBCM) for developing a Community Wildfire Protection Plan. Work on it is ongoing and will conclude June 2020

## Application in for Flood Risk Assessment Planning & Flood Mapping Grant

The Village has put in an application the Union of British Columbia Municipalities for 100% funding for an analysis of flooding by Tsunami, sea level rise and storm events. If funded the project will be carried out in 2020 & 2021.

## Application in for Sewer Lagoon Funding

The Village is putting an application at the end of February 2020 to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program to expand the Sewer Lagoon Facilities. If funded 73.33% will be covered by the Federal and Provincial governments and 26.6% by the municipality. Constructing new sewer lagoons will bring the municipality into compliance with Federal and Provincial sewage effluent discharge standards that our existing lagoon and aerator cannot meet.

## Application in for Sunset Park Improvement Project

The Village applied to the Gwaii Trust Major Contributions Grant for a matching \$50,000 grant towards the Sunset Park Trail Improvement Project. The project will consist of various repairs, remodeling and additions to the trail, campground and bird tower in the Sunset Park. The trail, bird tower and campground are highly utilized by residents and tourists alike making the Sunset Park Trail a vital recreational and travel component for the Village.

## Youth Grant

The Recreation Commission's Teen Centre project has received the 2019 Youth Grant and is expanding its entertainment offerings (video games, board games, activities) for Teens in the community. Teen Centre is every Friday at the Firehall from 7:00 PM—10:00 PM (closes early if no one comes out by 9:00 PM) until the last Friday of June 2020. Updates are posted on the Village's Facebook page.

## Water Update: Keep Checking for Leaks!

The earlier deep freeze event in January brought with it leak issues. Even if your pipes did not spring a leak during this event, they may as temperatures warm.

A leak may be immediately noticeable with a complete loss of pressure in the taps, or a barely-noticeable change with a smaller leak. Please inspect your pipes and keep vigilant for leaks.
