

Don't Forget your Home Owner's Grant

BC's Home Owner Grant (HOG) is a provincial grant provided to BC Home Owners to go against their property taxes on their primary residence .

Residents can claim the grant by completing and signing the form on the back of the property tax bill, and submitting it back to the Village Office.

Please note: the office must receive the completed form in order to apply the grant. If the form is incomplete or not submitted, then it cannot be applied.

Claim your HOG before the property tax penalty date. All outstanding balances receive a 10% penalty if they are unpaid after the penalty date. You can still claim the HOG after the penalty date, the 2020 HOG can be claimed until December 31st, 2020. .

Did you forget to claim your 2019 HOG? You can claim a retroactive HOG for it until December 31st, 2020. Please contact the office for more information.

What is the All-Island Response to COVID-19?

All the communities on Haida Gwaii are working together to respond to this pandemic. Their Emergency Operation Centres are working together, and this joint response is called Unified Command.

Together we are:

- Working on reducing non-essential travel to Haida Gwaii
- Operating checkpoints at access points
 - Such as at BC Ferries terminals in Prince Rupert and Skidegate
 - Monitoring local Harbours and providing information to vessels
- Developing permitting procedures for essential workers for EOCs to implement in their communities.

How has Port Clements Responded?

There is uncertainty in how COVID-19 will unfold at all levels of government and how governments can respond to reduce the impacts this pandemic has on all aspects of our lives.

The Village is responding by not increasing municipal property taxes for **2020** to help ease the burden felt by our community.

- This year's residential municipal property taxes have not increased from 2019. There is also a 30% decrease for business and light industry 2020 property taxes from the 2019 tax rates.
- The total taxes collected for municipal operations has been reduced by 12.8%.

Village of Port Clements Service Impacts due to COVID-19

During this pandemic, the Village of Port Clements services have been reduced to essential service levels to lessen exposure opportunities to staff and to the public. Listed below are the impacts to services:

- Closure of All Public Facilities & Event Cancellation
- Reduction of Public Attendance at Council Meetings
 Physical distancing is being enforced at Council Meetings and there is a limit of
 10 members for attendance.
- The Village is providing essential services in water, garbage & sewer services (including receiving bill payments).
- Staff are following the Public Health Order's measures at the Village Office Staff will meet residents at the <u>service window</u> if residents come to the office Please call ahead to let us know you are coming, or knock loudly on the window

What Does Not Flush

ONLY TWO THINGS GO DOWN THE TOILET: human waste (feces, urine) and toilet paper.

Please do not flush anything else down the toilet as it can damage and block sewer infrastructure and can be costly to repair or replace.

THINGS YOU SHOULD NOT FLUSH INCLUDE:

Disposable Diapers; Tampons and Tampon Applicators;

Sanitary Napkins; Cotton Balls and Swabs; Mini or Maxi pads;

Condoms; Cleaning wipes of any kind; Facial tissue;

Bandages and bandage wrappings; Automotive fluids;

Paint, solvents, sealants and thinners; Pet feces;

Poisons and hazardous waste

FLUSHABLE WIPES ARE NOT SAFE TO FLUSH

These products may claim to disintegrate, but often they do not disintegrate fast enough to prevent build up or blockage in the sewer system.
