

### Volume 12 Issue 3 **Projects & Grant Application Updates**

Village of Port Clements

The Village of Port Clements has updates on various projects that have been started in 2021, as well as the updates on securing funding for 2022 projects.

#### Projects Currently Underway:

- The Fire Hall Floor Replacement project is wrapping up to completion, but has experienced third-party delays on finishing materials due to the ongoing supply-chain issues with pandemic.
- The Froese subdivision streetlights is underway, with two pedestrian walking lights installed, but installation still pending on the main streetlights.
- The Public Works Yard Improvement project is ongoing but delayed due to ongoing third-party supply-chain issues.
- Water Treatment Plan Upgrades, such as the well 3 connection, are still in progress and is experiencing third-party delays and procurement issues.
- The Coastal Erosion and Flood Mapping Study (regional partnership) is in progress, expected to be completed in 2022.
- The Vibrant Commission Tourism Advocate project is underway, it is being extended into 2022 and approval is pending on scope changes.
- The Sewer Lagoon project is ongoing; our investing in Canada Infrastructure Program grant application was approved for the sewer lagoon project.

#### **Outstanding Grant Applications:**

The office is waiting to hear back from the Canada Community Revitalization Fund that was applied for the Community Park Improvement Project. Expected to hear back in new year.

#### **Don't Forget the Home Owner Grant**

If you still have not claimed your Home Owner Grant for 2021 and you are eligible to claim it, you have until December 31st, 2021 to claim it. After that it can still be claimed as a retroactive grant in 2022.

Home Owner Grants are not applied automatically, the eligible property owner has to submit an application each and every year in order to claim and receive a Home Owner Grant.

This year the province requires property owners to submit their application directly to the province, either by phone or online.
